As a teacher, one of my greatest joys is seeing my students grow and develop. I first met Pedro Abina in Torrance in 2017. He was the host student of my homeroom student, Eisuke. The following year, Eisuke hosted Pedro in Japan. The exchange with the classmates, including the two of them, continues to this day. I was very happy to be working with Pedro as a colleague. I believe that he came back to Japan because of the wonderful memories he had of interacting with Ichikashi during his high school days. I am very grateful for that, and at the same time, I am

proud that I am involved in such a wonderful international exchange program.

In Japan, there is an expression, "show your back." This means to set a good example for your juniors by your actions, not by explaining things verbally (He literally has a great back because he works out every day at the school gym...).

As a teacher, he set a good example for his students and juniors. By sharing his experiences during his homestay, what he found rewarding, and what made him happy, the students were able to participate more actively in the program. During the "Happy Friday Lunch" every Friday, he helped the students grow by being a good conversation partner and mentor.

Pedro, I wish you even more success in the future. You have worked very hard both in your Japanese studies and in your life in Japan. You can now write kanji and katakana better than I can. As your homeroom teacher, I am proud of you. When you come back to Japan, I will treat you to your favorite Teradaya ramen!

Thank you to Ms. Lori and everyone at TSCA for always watching over Ichikashi with kindness. We all are happy to be able to continue this bond with you.

I want to take a moment to sincerely thank the board for this teaching opportunity. Living and working in Japan has been one of the most meaningful and formative experiences of my life. It certainly presented challenges—not so much because of cultural or linguistic differences, but because it required me to step outside of familiar structures and face aspects of myself I hadn't previously paid much attention to. In doing so, I grew in ways I didn't expect.

I learned a great deal about Japan, and those lessons only deepened my admiration for the people and values here. One lesson, in particular, has stayed with me: "How you do anything is how you do everything." There's a similar Japanese saying—「一事が万事」(Ichiji ga banji).

Before coming here, I had heard that phrase, but it never quite resonated. Over the past two years, though, I've seen it embodied in daily life. Whether someone is mowing the lawn in a public area, preparing documents, or wrapping up purchased items, there is care and attention in every task. Nothing is treated as too small to matter. That mindset has taught me that consistency, intention, and pride in your work—even in the smallest actions—can shape not only how others see you, but how you see yourself.

It's a principle I want to carry forward with me in both my personal and professional life.

Thank you again for your continued support. I'm incredibly grateful to have been part of this program.
